## **CREATION**

The European Network for Public Ethics was created in June 2022, at the initiative of the High Authority for Transparency in Public Life in France. The National Anti-Corruption Authority of Italy currently holds the presidency of the network, for a term of two years until October 2026 and the High Authority manages its secretariat.

## **OBJECTIVES**

The network aims at promoting a culture of public integrity and at harmonizing the rules in this area within the Member States of the European Union. The network ambitions to be the privileged interlocutor of the European institutions on issues of **integrity, transparency** and **public ethics**.

## **MEMBERS**

The network currently brings together 15 public integrity authorities from the Member States of the European Union: the Federal Bureau of Anticorruption of Austria, the Federal Ethics Commission of Belgium, the Commission of Decision on Conflicts of Interest of Croatia, the Independent Authority Against Corruption of Cyprus, the Ministry of Justice of the Czech Republic, the High Authority for Transparency in Public Life of France, the National Transparency Authority of Greece, the Integrity Authority of Hungary, the National Anticorruption Authority of Italy, the Chief Official Ethics Commission of Lithuania, the Commissioner for Standards in Public Life of Malta, the Transparency Entity of Portugal, the National Integrity Agency of Romania, the Commission for the prevention of corruption of Slovenia, the Office of Conflicts of interest of Spain.

The network can also welcome observer members who can contribute to its activities without taking part in its governance.
